

VENTURA COUNTY.**Suit of Mary Green vs. Southern Pacific Will Be Retried.**

VENTURA, March, 5.—[Regular Correspondence.] The suit of Mary Green vs. the Southern Pacific Railroad Company will come up in the Superior Court Tuesday morning for retrial. The case was tried in the same court two years ago, when the plaintiff was awarded \$9000 damages for the death of her husband, the result of a railroad accident. The defendant appealed and the Supreme Court remanded the case back for retrial.

The Superior Court has sustained the decision of the lower court in the suit of Ortego vs. the County, whereby interpreters are allowed in the justice of the peace courts, with \$3 per diem for their services, which the county must pay. The Board of Supervisors rejected all such claims, and the interpreters combined and assigned their claims to Luis Ortego. These bills for the entire county amount to considerable each month.

The will of the late Mrs. Eliza Wells was admitted to probate yesterday, and D. S. Blackburn and J. S. Collins appointed executors. This estate is valued at not over \$16,000, consisting of real estate in Redlands and in this city, and cash.
