Suit of Mary Green vie Southern Pacific Will Be Retried.

VENTURA, March, 5.-[Regular Correspondence.] The suit of Mary Green vs. the Southern Pacific Railroad Company will come up in the Superior Court Tuesday morning for retrial. The case was tried in the same court two years ago, when the plaintiff was awarded \$900 dumages for the death of her husband, the result of a milroad accident. The defendant appealed and the Supreme Court remanded the case back for retrial.
