(VENTURA COUNTY.) COUNCIL CUTS RATE.

Ventura Municipality Will Pay Less for Water, but Citizens Will Still Day the Same

Pay the Same.

VENTURA, March 7.-The City Council has made a slight cut in the water rate for water furnished the municipality, while letting the rates to consumers generally stand as before. Last year the town paid \$1081.75 for water for all purposes. The board has cut \$17.50 a month off this amount. For use at the Plaza and Hill schools It has been paying \$15 per month for water though the latter school has quate supply. This amount has been cut to \$10 per month. For the High School, \$7.50 per month has heretofore been paid, and has now been cut to \$5 per month. The rate paid for water for sprinkling and including water for town general purposes outside of cemetery purposes, has heretofore been \$50 per month. This has been cut to \$25, and an allowance made of \$15 per month for cemetery purposes, making a reduction of \$10 per month, or \$17.50 per month all told. While a greater cut than this was expected, it is con-sidered that, this will help the town tide over the shortage which will soon occur in funds, when it may be neces-sary, says the City Clerk, to curtail expenses still more by shutting down for a time on street Nghts, or in some other. quarter.

CIGAR STARTS BLAZE.

At 2:30 o'clock this morning the night watchman discovered a fire in the Board of Trade room in the City Hall. Investigation showed that some one, the night before, had dropped a cigar but into the wooden box used for a cuspidor, which had lighted the sawdust in the box. The fire had burned through the box and was making good headway in the floor when discovered. A hole a foot in diameter was the damage and a bucket of wator saved the building.

TO PURCHASE PLANT.

The water company introduced a resolution at the last Council meeting which asked that the city agree to purchase the plant at the end of three years. at a price to be agreed upon by arbitration. The resolution was put over for future consideration.
